ONE BITE from an infected mosquito can give your pet heartworm disease.

Heartworm disease is prevalent in **ALL 50 STATES**.

Heartworms can grow up to **ONE FOOT** long.

More than **ONE MILLION PETS** in the U.S. have heartworm disease.

SIGNS

- Mild, persistent cough
- Lethargy
- Decreased appetite
- Weight loss

There is no approved treatment for cats. Prevention is their only means of protection.

Some pets show NO symptoms until the disease has progressed.

Heart Healthy Tips

- Give heartworm prevention year-round.
- Visit our hospital for routine checkups.
- Keep pets indoors at dawn and dusk.
- Remove standing water from flowerpots, toys, wheelbarrows, grill covers, etc.
