Why is dental care so important?

Bacteria associated with periodontal disease can enter the bloodstream, damaging your pet's heart, kidneys, and liver.

Signs of periodontal disease in pets:

- Bad breath
- Swollen or bleeding gums
- Discolored teeth Pawing at the mouth
- Difficulty eating Excessive drooling

Why does your pet need professional dental care?

Over two-thirds of each tooth is hiding beneath the gumline and can only be evaluated with x-rays.
