Candy made with xylitol can be toxic to cats, leading to a dangerous drop in blood sugar.

6 Be sensible with stuffed animals.

Button eyes and noses, ribbons, bows and stuffing are not safe for pets.

7 Beware of batteries.

Button batteries in greeting cards can cause serious injury if swallowed.

8 Be cautious with cocktails.

Even small amounts of alcohol can be life threatening to pets.
